

## FACULTY POSITIONS Probationary (Tenure-Track) – Assistant Professor – 2 open positions

The School of Health Studies invites applications from exceptional, early-career scholars for **two** probationary (tenure-track) appointments at the rank of Assistant Professor. <u>The School of Health Studies</u>, one of six Schools in the Faculty of Health Sciences, is home to a large undergraduate *Bachelor of Health Sciences (BHSc)* program, and contributes significantly to the Faculty-wide <u>Health & Rehabilitation Sciences graduate program</u>, the joint graduate program in <u>Health Information Science</u> and the <u>Interfaculty Program in Public Health</u>.

The School of Health Studies is a leader in transformative interdisciplinary and international research, education and knowledge mobilization regarding health and wellbeing and health care across the life course. Qualified applicants must have a PhD or equivalent, with training in a relevant discipline related to health sciences and a research program that complements our existing research foci of health promotion, systems analysis and policy and knowledge mobilization and the signature research areas identified in the Faculty of Health Sciences' <u>Strategic Research Plan</u>. The successful candidates will have opportunities to develop collaborative relationships with a number of Faculties and Research Centers and Institutes at Western, including the <u>Canadian Centre for Activity and Aging</u>, the <u>Centre for Research on Health Equity and Social Inclusion</u> and the <u>Rotman Institute of Philosophy</u> among others. Applicants will have a commitment to, and evidence of, the ability to provide high quality, innovative and contemporary teaching in the classroom, as well as mentoring at the graduate and undergraduate students. The positions will commence on **July 1, 2022** or as negotiated. Salary commensurate with qualifications and experience.
